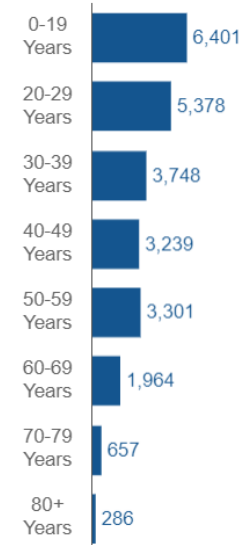

Cases

Confirmed Cases

Today there were **2,252** new, confirmed cases reported bringing the total to **598,177** total confirmed cases.

Probable Cases

Today, there were **247** new, probable cases reported bringing the total to **37,403** total probable cases.

Estimated Active Cases

There are an estimated **31,911** currently active COVID-19 cases.

Testing

Tests Reported

There were **115,453** new COVID-19 molecular tests reported, bringing the cumulative total to **18,821,008** tests.

Turn Around Time

The current turn around time for a molecular test is **1.29** days.

Percent Positivity

The 7-day average of percent positivity is **2.53%**.

Hospitalizations

Hospitalizations

There are **690** patients hospitalized for COVID-19.

ICU & Intubated Patients

There are **169** patients in Intensive Care Units (ICU) and **93** patients are intubated.

Average Age of Patients

The average age of patients who were hospitalized for COVID-19 was **64** years old.

Confirmed Deaths

There were **36** new, confirmed deaths reported. There have been **16,844** confirmed deaths in total.

Probable Deaths

There were **1** new, probable deaths reported. There have been **341** probable deaths in total.

PHASE ONE

In order of priority

- Clinical and non-clinical healthcare workers doing direct and COVID-facing care
- Long term care facilities, rest homes and assisted living facilities
- Police, Fire and Emergency Medical Services
- Congregate care settings (including corrections and shelters)
- Home-based healthcare workers
- Healthcare workers doing non-COVID-facing care
School nurses

School Psychologist, Speech/Language

December - February

Estimated timeframes



PHASE TWO

In order of priority

- Individuals with 2+ comorbidities (high risk for COVID-19 complications)
- Early education, **K-12**, transit, grocery, utility, food and agriculture, sanitation, public works and public health workers
- Adults 65+ **& 75+**
- Individuals with one comorbidity

February - April



PHASE THREE

Vaccine available to general public

April - June

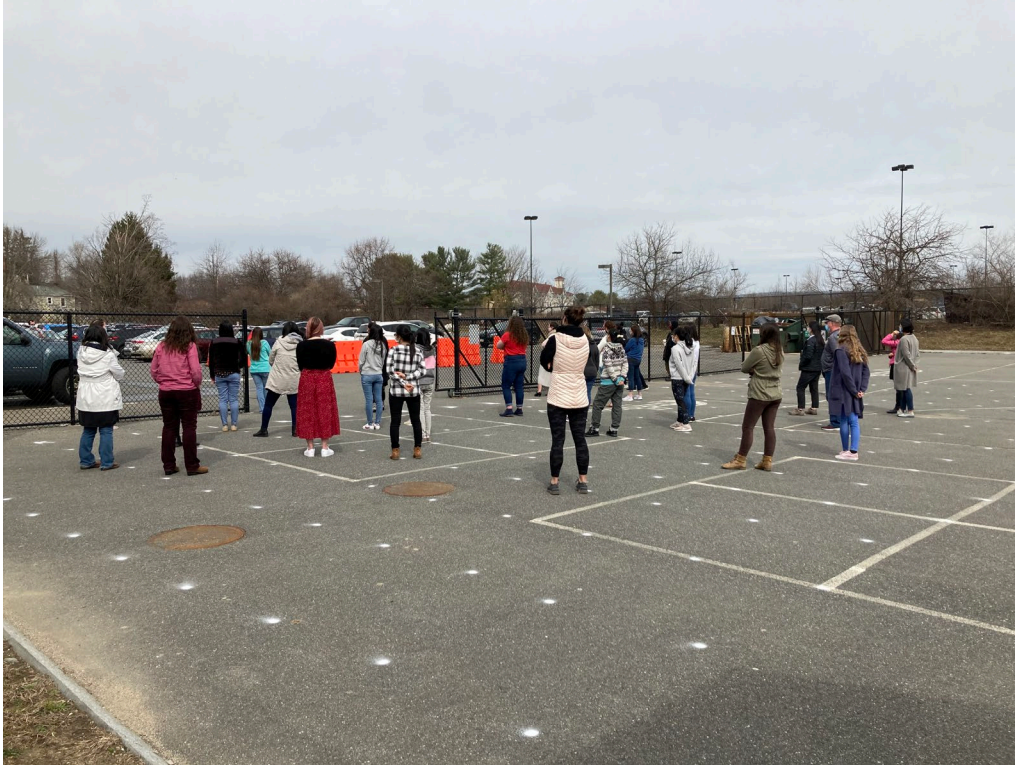

Covid safety precautions and rules are in effect throughout the building.

Multi-functional Outdoor Spaces



- Zoned spaces – signup system.
- Reserved zones for lunch.
- Recess, PE, academic.

K-5 - Full Week In Person, 8:30 am to 2:30 pm

- No hybrid model, only K-5 full in person or opt in remote.
- ~80% in person, ~20% remote, with rosters being revised as parents opt in.
- One daily schedule with remote students linking into in person classes.
- Outdoor bridge program for bus students and siblings waiting for MS/HS siblings, 2:30-3:15 pm.

MS/HS Models – Full week, 8:30 am to 3:15 pm

- Full In person - for DESE high priority categories or to match elementary sibling full in person schedule.
- Robust Hybrid – alternating week model with roughly half of the students in school each week. This is a transition phase until full return in late April/early May.
- Remote Opt-In - parents may opt to keep their student(s) in a remote model.

Timeline – Cronología - 时间表

April – June 2021

- Goal – stability and continuity of educational program.
- As of today, there are 45 school days remaining.
- Continuing operational changes to prepare for full return of middle and high school.
 - Middle school target return April 26-28, one grade per day.
 - High school target return TBD, awaiting DESE guidelines however expected to be near Middle school return date
- Spring testing season starts in April – website has dates.
- Summer program planning period.
